I cannot believe a whole year has already passed. This past year seemed to fly by, but even so, the Brown County Humane Society was able to accomplish some remarkable things. In 2018 we maintained an amazing save rate of 98%. We helped nearly 550 pets find new homes with loving families, and reunited more than 120 pets with their owners. # 98% Save Rate—714 lives saved

Our generous donors provided nearly 60% of our revenue.



**545** cats and dogs found new families and 124 lost pets were reunited with their owners.

Over **17,150** pounds of food and over 46 bales of straw were given to animals in need in our community.

Our 20 amazing foster volunteers provided extra special care to **201** pets before they found their new home.


We saved 67 dogs and cats from struggling shelters across the Midwest.




# Financial Stability


