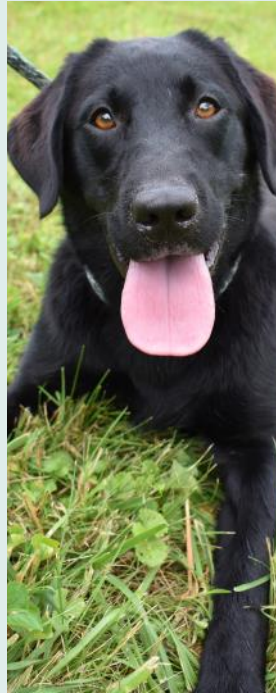

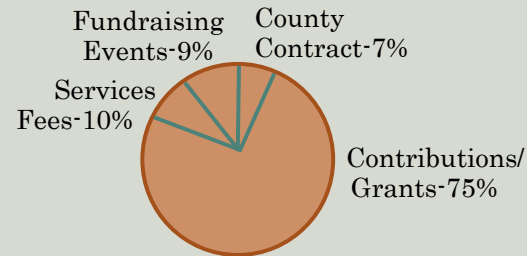
Financial Recap

Brown County Humane Society depends on generous donations from individuals, businesses and foundations to operate its shelter and adoption facilities and to provide community outreach services to Brown County residents.

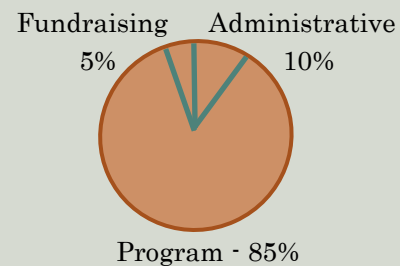
Not included in the expense amounts shown are the countless hours of operating, administrative, and fundraising services provided daily by volunteers throughout the year.

Last year proved to be another challenging year for so many in our community. But, as always, our supporters rallied together and ensured that the homeless pets received the care they needed to begin a new life.

In 2022 we served over 700 pets. The hard work of our staff, volunteers and many others led to a save rate of nearly 99%! That marks our sixth year with a save rate above 98%. This is an achievement that we should all be very proud of!

Not only did we serve the homeless pets of Brown County, we happily welcomed the return of the Rabies Vaccination Clinic in April. With a new drive-thru approach, we were able to serve 344 owned dogs and cats ensuring they received vaccinations, an exam from a veterinarian as well as offering microchipping. The health of our community pets is just as important as the shelter pets and we were thrilled to renew this service.

I hope you enjoy reviewing the successes you helped create in 2022. Whether you donated, adopted, volunteered, advocated, or saved a lost pet, you are the reason we are able to continue saving hundreds of lives every year. And, we cannot wait to do it again this year.

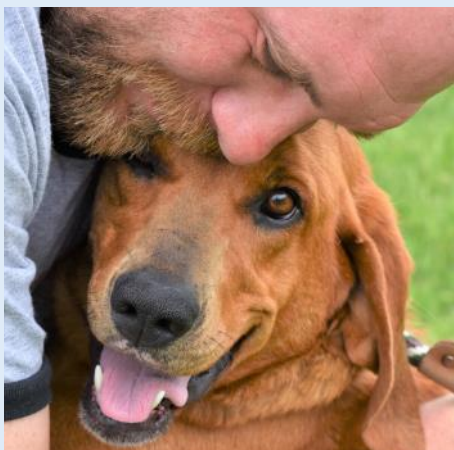
