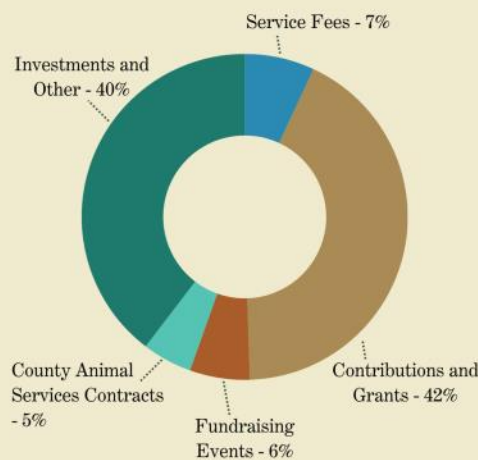


Financial Recap

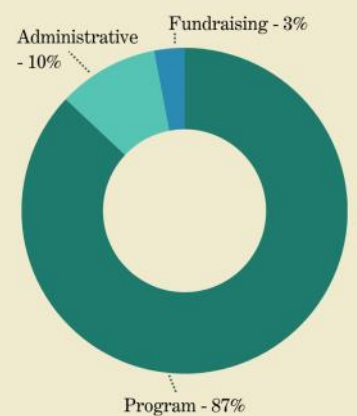
Brown County Humane Society depends on generous donations from individuals, businesses and foundations to operate its shelter and adoption facilities and to provide community outreach services to Brown County residents.

2023 was a year that reminded me how amazing our supporters are and how, despite many unexpected challenges, we still came together and saved lives.

The year saw a dramatic shift in the animal welfare arena and resulted in many shelters struggling to meet the demands of the new normal. BCHS was not immune to this change. The number of lost dogs returning to their owners is down over 10% compared to previous year. The length of time each dog and cat spent with us has increased to more than it has been in several years.

Despite these challenges, we still served over 630 pets. The hard work of our staff, volunteers and many others led to a save rate of nearly 99%! That marks our seventh year with a save rate above 98%. Being able to maintain this amazing save rate is something we should all be extremely proud of!

I hope you enjoy reviewing the successes you helped create in 2023. Whether you donated, adopted, volunteered, advocated, or saved a lost pet, you are the reason we are able to meet the challenges and still celebrate so many successes. Thank you for helping us save the lives of so many deserving pets.
